

CITING YOUR SOURCES (MLA Format)

In your Works Cited list, the first line of the citation is flush with the left margin and the other lines of that citation are indented one-half inch from the left margin in a format called “hanging indention.” Double-space the entire list, both between and within entries.

Book by One Author

Crompton, Samuel Willard. *100 Americans Who Changed History*. Milwaukee: World Almanac, 2005. Print.

Book by Two or More Authors

Broer, Lawrence R., and Gloria Holland. *Hemingway and Women: Female Critics and the Female Voice*. Tuscaloosa: U of Alabama P, 2002. Print.

Book with an Editor

Weisser, Susan Ostrov, ed. *Women and Romance: A Reader*. New York: New York UP, 2001. Print.

Book by a Corporate Author

National Research Council. *Beyond Six Billion: Forecasting the World's Population*. Washington: Natl. Acad., 2000. Print.

Book with No Author or Editor Given

American Heritage Guide to Contemporary Usage and Style. Boston: Houghton, 2005. Print.

Encyclopedia Article (World Book, Britannica, etc.)

“Japan.” *The Encyclopedia Americana*. 2008 ed. Print.

(For a signed article, give the name of the author at the beginning, last name first.)

A Multivolume Work

Sadie, Stanley, ed. *The New Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians*. 2nd ed. 29 vols. New York: Grove, 2001. Print.

Reprinted Article

Holladay, Hillary. “Narrative Space in Ann Petry’s *Country Place*.” *Xavier Review* 16.1 (1996): 21-35. Rpt. in *Twentieth Century Literary Criticism*. Ed. Linda Pavlovski and Scott Darga. Vol. 112. Detroit: Gale, 2002. 356-62. Print.

Web Publications

Name of the author or editor of the work, title of the work, title of the overall Web site, version used, sponsor of the site, date of publication, medium of publication (*Web*), date of access. Each item is followed by a period except the publisher or sponsor, which is followed by a comma. **(If you cannot find some of this information, cite what is available.)**

GENERAL RULE

Magazine article

Author. "Title of Article." *Original Source of Article* Date of article: page numbers. *Title of the Database*.
Web. Date of access.

An article from a book

Author. "Title of Article." *Original Source of Article*. Publication information. *Title of the Database*.
Web. Date of access.

Give the URL of the database article only if your teacher requires it. (*If you give a URL, give it after the date of access, a period, and a space. Enclose the URL in angle brackets, and follow with a period.*)
