(FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS)

Do I need my own **transportation** to attend classes at Miller Career & Technology Center?

*You do not need your own transportation, however you **may** drive. Please see the course catalog or application for specifics regarding transportation. The only courses **requiring** student provided transportation are internships as indicated with a car icon. 🚗*

The career course I want to take requires concurrent enrollment in a course I don't want to take. What should I do?

*Students will attend MCTC for a minimum of three credits. Most career courses are **two credits**. Two credit courses **will be paired with a core credit** to fit the student's course request/needs. Certain courses require concurrent enrollment in a specific core course, which is indicated by the course as a **co-requisite or concurrent enrollment**. (i.e. **PACE** students **are required** to take AP English IV or AP English IV GT at Miller). Availability of courses is subject to scheduling.*

Will my class be scheduled in the morning or the afternoon?

Student enrollment will drive the schedule. There will be students scheduled throughout the day, typically in a 3 period block, however some afternoon students will be here for 4 periods. Students are required to attach their course selection sheet to the application. This will help to let us know what other courses you plan to take and therefore attempt to schedule your time at Miller when it best fits your need.

Can I take **Health Science Technology I (HST I)** at Miller?

HST I is only available at the home campuses, not at Miller. It is not offered during summer school.

Can I take more than one career class at Miller?

Yes, depending on your particular circumstances. It is essential for you to complete courses required for graduation in a timely manner. Mark both courses on your application, rank them by order of preference and include a note that you would really like to be in both.

Will I be able to attend **class meetings** and **pep rallies** at my home campus if I attend Miller?

Miller will adjust your class schedule when there is an altered schedule at the home campus so students may attend.

Will I **graduate from Miller Career & Technology Center**?

Miller is an auxiliary campus. Our purpose is to provide additional opportunities to KISD high school juniors and seniors that are too specialized and expensive to offer at each home campus. Miller students will graduate from their home campus.

How much does it **cost** to go to Miller Career & Technology Center?

There is no tuition or instructor fee associated with attending. Miller is open to all KISD juniors and seniors as another location to take KISD courses. Any fees indicated for particular courses are for supplies. Please direct any concerns about course fees to the Miller counselor.

Can I begin courses at Miller as a senior?

Yes, students may begin courses as either a junior or a senior.

If I begin a two year program as a senior how will I benefit?

All career courses provide students with the opportunity to experience a career area prior to pursuing that field after high school graduation. Some courses offer articulated or ATC credit. Cosmetology is unique in that the hours clocked during participation in any the course will transfer to post-secondary Cosmetology programs in Texas.

How is it possible to earn **P.E. credit** through career courses?

*All two credit or more career courses (also known as Career & Technical Education or CTE courses) may be taken for elective credit **or** one P.E. credit.*
