SUCCESS FACTORS

1. Follow directions the first time given.
2. Be in class with all needed materials before the tardy bell.
3. Follow classroom procedures.

CONSEQUENCES FOR CLASSROOM MISCONDUCT

4th Offense Office Referral

Severe Clause Major violations of the discipline code, including fighting, vandalism, defying a teacher and interfering with the educational setting will result in immediate removal from class.

TARDIES

Students are expected to be in class on time. Students who enter any class late (up to 5 minutes) will adhere to the procedures below. Over 5 minutes late will be an office referral.

LUNCH EXPECTATIONS

- Students are to report promptly to the cafeteria for their assigned lunch periods.
- Students are to make food purchases upon arriving at the cafeteria.
- Students must have their ID's to purchase food from the hot lunch line.
- Students using temporary ID's in the cafeteria will be assigned an immediate lunch detention.
- "Saving seats" is not allowed.
- Running and horseplay in the cafeteria is unsafe and is not permitted.
- Students are expected to find a seat upon leaving the lunch line and remain in it during the entire lunch period.
- Students are expected to respond appropriately to directions given by any adult.
- The snack bar closes SIX (6) minutes prior to the end of lunch.
- Students must remain seated and get quiet in order for an adult at the microphone to dismiss them. Students may not leave the cafeteria, even if the bell rings, until an adult dismisses them.

ADVISORY GUIDELINES

STUDENTS WILL:

- Have and show planner to teacher
- Listen to any school wide lessons
- Quietly work
- Do homework, study, work on daily school-wide lessons
- Read a book.

STUDENTS MAY (WITH TEACHER PERMISSION):

- Work collaboratively with another student on math work
- Work with another student on school work.

STUDENTS WILL NOT:

- Have free time
- Talk loudly or be distracting to the others
- Sleep
- Chew gum
- Draw (unless working on an Art assignment)
- Play Cards.

SECONDARY STUDENT DRESS CODE

SHIRTS/BLOUSES

Shirts/blouses may be:

- Any collared shirt/blouse
- T-shirts and other pull-over tops
- Sweatshirts/sweaters
- School designs/logos; brand names or other appropriate words are acceptable.

Shirts and blouses must be buttoned in accordance with design and appropriateness.

Students are prohibited from wearing shirts/blouses that:

- Are oversized or immodestly undersized
- Depict or reference alcohol, drugs, tobacco, weapons, nudity, gang affiliation, death, violence, vulgar or obscene language or images, and/or insults to race, religion, gender, or ethnicity, or other emblems or writing that may be expected to cause a material or substantial disruption of, or interference with, normal school operations.

Undershirts, tank tops, see-through clothing, pajamas, blouses or clothing with spaghetti straps, or shirts/blouses that expose the midriff when the arms are raised are not to be worn.

PANTS/SLACKS

Acceptable pants/slacks are worn at the waist, belted, if appropriate, and not "baggy".

Pants/Slacks may not be:

- Touching the ground or covering the foot
- Made of spandex or other form-fitting materials
- Baggy or oversized.

SHORTS

Acceptable shorts are no shorter than mid-thigh for all grades.

Shorts may not be:

- Made of spandex or other form-fitting materials
- Baggy or oversized
- Split or fringed at the hem or seams
- Boxers or pajamas.

DRESSES/SKORTS/SKIRTS

Dresses/skorts/skirts are:

- Worn at the waist (skirts/skorts)
- No shorter than mid-thigh for all grades.

Dress tops must meet the guidelines required for blouses and shirts.

Dresses/skorts/skirts may not be spandex or other form-fitting.

Slits in skirts or dresses must be modest.

High-slashed apparel is not acceptable.

SHOES

Shoes must be:

- Worn at all times
- Chosen for safety and health reasons and for quietness.

Platform soles over 1 inch high and rubber flip-flops are not recommended for safety reasons. House shoes and shower shoes are not acceptable.

HAIR

Hair must be clean, well-groomed and out of the eyes, and shall be styled in a way that is neither distracting nor conspicuous.

Facial hair such as mustaches, beards, and goatees is not allowed.

Males may not wear sideburns below the earlobes.

Hair styles that create a safety hazard or a material or substantial disruption are not permitted.

JEWELRY

Earrings, hair jewelry, watches, bracelets, rings and necklaces that are not a safety hazard or a material or substantial disruption may be worn. Visible jewelry or body piercing other than earrings are not allowed

Jewelry that is considered gang-related is not allowed.

Jewelry (including earrings, chains, emblems, etc.) which is considered to be a safety hazards or a material or substantial disruption is not permitted.

GENERAL

School-approved uniforms for physical education, athletics, pep rallies, etc., may be worn only during the class or activity for which they are approved.

For unique special events the campus administration may establish event-specific dress code requirements.

Hats, caps, headbands, bandanas, or scarves shall not be worn indoors except in the interest of religious practices, safety, cleanliness, or with the permission of the principal.

No article of apparel shall be worn that will in any way damage school property, create a safety hazard, or create a material or substantial disruption to the school environment.
